Wolf Run G Sanitary Sewer Project Update

Work is underway on the Wolf Run G Sanitary Sewer Project, which began **May 8, 2025**, and is scheduled to finish by **May 8, 2026**.

So far, crews have installed

 9 manholes (36%) and 1,196 feet of sewer line (27%).

Remaining

 16 manholes and 3,293 feet of sewer line.

The project staging area remains on Lafayette Parkway near Lone Oak Drive.
